MINUTES of the 47th EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, Thursday June 11th at 19.30pm at Cambridge Terrace.

1. MINUTES of May 14 signed as correct.

2. MATTERS ARISING from May 14.

3a. Peverley Publication:- JG introduced his discussion paper, which had been circulated before the meeting. The paper addressed 4 questions and 7 general points which JG elaborated. The main development, following a talk with Christine Waterman, was that she was willing to act as editor, after a working party from the Society had produced a design brief. JG thought there should be a frontispiece defining the role of the Society in promoting the publication. JW professed himself delighted. A long discussion ensued with contributions from PK, AFA, ML, JC, SC, KB, JG, JO. PK wanted major restructuring, treating the Western Heights as a whole. Finance was discussed in detail as was the role of Douglas Welby, as Publisher and distributor.

AFA suggested a vote on the issue of transferring £380 interest in the funds to the publication. KB agreed. The financial aspect in JG's paper, page 2, paragraph 4, was accepted with the deletion of F.O.C. which should read 'at half price'. JO said that the protracted discussion over 3 meetings had been very fruitful and enabled members to come to a decision.

Finally the Committee voted on the following resolution:-

RESOLUTION: That we proceed with our intention to publish a booklet on the Western Heights, and with this in view, appoint a working party to produce a design brief for the book, to be edited by Christine Waterman - under the financial restraints of para. 4 page 2 of JG's paper of 10.2.1992.

A working party was set up: JW, PK, ML. CW to attend meetings.
